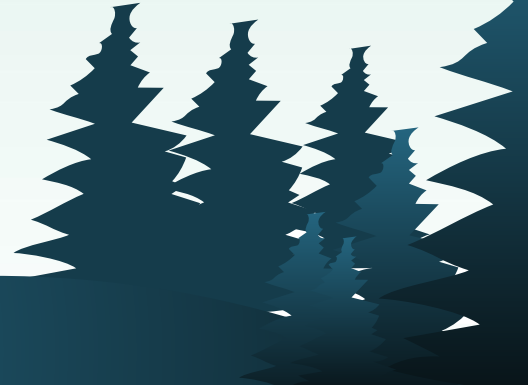

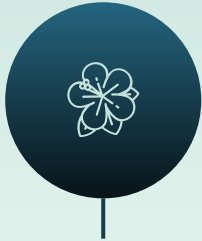

Environmental stewardship curriculum, place-based learning, and service instill in students respect for our planet.




Why Boise, Idaho?

- Rich Natural Environment to Incorporate Place-Based Education as a Defining Feature of Curriculum
- Rapidly Growing Markets
 - Net Migration Rate - Exceeding 20% in Each Year Since 2013
- Affordable Living Cost
 - Median Home Price - \$324 Per Sq. Ft. (*Most Urban Markets report MHP of \$550 Per Sq. Ft.*)
